



The historical records that have been found indicate that every Pagoria that is walking the Earth today have a common ancestor in Isodoro Pagoria (born in 1730) and his son Filippo (born in 1752). Both ancestors were born in Caccamo, Italy, where the Pagorias stayed until well into the 19th century.

The roots of the Pagoria name cannot be found in the current Italian language. Its origin is unknown. There have been a few derivatives of the name over the centuries. The 17th century spelling was predominantly Pauria, with a less frequent spelling of Paguria. Paoria and Pagoria are used interchangeably well into the latter part of the 19th century. Pagoria became the common spelling in the 20th century, with a few ancestors retaining the Paoria name in Alia, Italy.

There was a major immigration of Pagorias to the United States from 1880 – 1910. The six male children that came to the United States in this timeframe are the ancestors of all Pagorias (that have retained their last name) that are living in the United States in the 21st century.
